The life of Queen Victoria

Queen (Victoria) was born on 24th May 1819 and came to the British throne on the 20th June (1837) when she was only 18 years old, after the death of her uncle, William IV. In the early years of her reign she appointed the prime minister, Lord Melbourne, as an advisor and worked with him until her marriage to her German cousin, Prince (Albert), in 1840.

Victoria and Albert had nine (children) and were very happily married until his death from (typhoid) in 1861, during which time she helped him to create the Great (Exhibition) of 1851, full of (inventions) and artwork which was a true wonder of the Victorian period. After Albert's death, Queen Victoria decided to wear black to remember him, and she kept up this tradition for the rest of her life in memory of her beloved Prince Albert, even making sure that his (clothes) were laid out every day in the same way that they were when he was alive.

During her rule, the British (Empire) grew and grew to the point where it was the largest empire that had ever e isted, ruling over a quarter of the world's (population). This huge expansion meant that British inventions and industry were the best in the world and this made the population of Britain double during her (reign) as more and more workers came to Britain, and more children were born to existing British people.

While the (lives) of her people were often difficult, the living conditions for most people improved during her reign and over a (million) people turned up to her funeral in London in (1901) to pay their respects.

The reign of Britain's longest serving (Monarch) was finally over.
